This year's theme for Women's History Month is "Celebrating Women who Tell our Stories." The Numbers:

- -168 million: US population in 2021 that identify as female
- -36.1%: Percentage of women 25 and older who earned Bachelor's degrees or higher (compared to 33.9% men)
- -81.5%: Percentage of full-time, year-round female workers over 16 years' median earnings compared to men in 2021
- -65%: Percentage Black and Latinx women with only a Bachelor's degree make compared to White men with same education
- -8,643: Number of physicians in WA State who identify as female in 2020 (of 21,731 total physicians)


